## *Hearts for Jesus*

Since 1972, Lutheran schools of the Michigan District – LCMS have joined together annually in February for what is called the *Hearts for Jesus* mission project. During the past 38 years, Lutheran students in Michigan have raised over 1.2 million dollars for a variety of missions, most often ones that reach out to children.

This year's *Hearts for Jesus* project is The Lutheran Malaria Initiative. Our Chapel offerings for the months of December, January, and February will go towards this cause. Mr. Kumm led a chapel on Wed., Jan. 27 that helped explain the need associated with this disease. We talked about the parable of the Good Samaritan and how we can be like the Good Samaritan in our support of the Lutheran Malaria Initiative – through both our offerings, but most importantly our prayers.

Just \$10 provides a family with a bed net that will protect a child or family member from mosquito bites throughout the night while they sleep. One bed net will last up to 4 years.

We may not think that \$10 is a lot of money, but consider this: the average family income for a family in Kenya is \$1600 per year. So a \$10 gift can have a major impact on a family living on this kind of an income, plus it provides protection from an otherwise incurable disease.

Join me in prayer for the Lutheran Malaria Initiative. Consider how you can help support this project – through both prayer and offering. Take some time to lift this up in prayer with your children.

- Malaria kills more than a million people a year, but it is easily prevented and treated.
- Malaria is a disease of poverty. It exacerbates the conditions of poverty by making people too sick to work or tend their fields, becoming a major barrier for people trying to lift themselves out of poverty.
- A child dies from malaria every thirty seconds.
- Three quarters of those killed by malaria are pregnant women and children under the age of five in Africa.
