*"Jesus told him, 'Go back home. Your son will live.'" John 4:50
For further reading, read John 46-54*

Note: This devotion is based on the Devotion for Jan. 18 from the devotional book One Year Devotions for Men on the Go.

The man took Jesus at his word and departed. He was not used to taking people at their word like this. Usually he needed more proof. But this was his moment of greatest need. His son was deathly ill, and the doctors could not help him. His last resort was to turn to Jesus and plead for his help.

"Lord," he pleaded, "please come now before my little boy dies."

The way Jesus said "Your son will live" changed this man's life on the spot. There was such conviction in Jesus' voice, such authority and confidence that the man immediately believed him and went on his way.

He didn't need to see the results to believe, because the Son of God had spoken them. He didn't need the opinions of others, because the author of creation had spoken. The simple word of God calmed his heart in the most dire situation he had ever faced.

This is what happens when you encounter the Word of God. It rings in your soul and inspires your faith. It supersedes all other opinions and banishes all doubts. It addresses your heart's fears and sets you back on course for the adventure of your life.

In what areas do you need to hear the simple and clear Word of God? What situations in your life need God's insight? Ask God to provide his wisdom in these areas, and then read the Bible expecting to hear from Him.

This is a beautiful example of **faith**. I don't know about you, but all I see in the news is gloom and doom. You turn around and there is another complaint about something and the tone is "woe is me". I understand that there are struggles in life. God never promised us it would be easy. We do live in a world of sin.

However, I know that I pray a prayer every week asking God for my **daily bread** and guess what – He provides. God continues to bless us with what we need – not always what we want – but what we need. He loves us, protects us, and promises to always be near us. I am guilty of this as I am sure most of us all are, but I know there are times when we want to take control of a situation or have control of a situation and we forget who guides us. This is when frustration or failure sets in – when we are blind to the fact that God is there to help us. He is speaking to us and loves us as His child. During times of struggle we need to listen to God. We need to go to Him in prayer and rely on our faith.
